Gatherer to Gardener Program Location

All programs take place or begin at the historic Hjertoos House, or in the historic barn on the Carnation Tree Farm in Carnation, Washington, unless otherwise specified or arranged (occasional excursions may start at another location). The street address is 31523 NE 40th St, Carnation, or enter through the Carnation Tree Farm on Hiway 203 in Carnation and drive to the large house in the back of that property. We are on the main bus route for those who use public transportation.

Requirements & Eligibility for the Program

These programs are open to all levels of knowledge and previous experience. Workshops, walks and apprenticeship programs are designed for varying levels of skills and interests. Most activities require some level of physical ability so please provide information if you have a physical limitation so we can adjust for your needs as possible.

Youth 12 and over will be accepted on a limited basis in the company of a legal guardian for the Plant Walks, Ethnobotany Weekend and Basketry classes.

Instructor: Heidi Bohan is lead instructor for all classes with occasional guest instructors for some programs. Heidi has a lifetime of experience in ethnobotany, horticulture, 15 years of professional woodworking skills, and over 20 years of intensive work with traditional knowledge of the Pacific Northwest and beyond. www.heidibohan.com

Plant Walk Excursions: Generally plant walks will require transportation to local unique habitats to visit plants. We will meet at a specified location, usually the Hjertoos House, and carpool from there. We will arrange carpools prior to trips, and ask that those who travel as guests in cars provide a generous gas donation to the driver. Please dress for weather, and you will be notified if you need special gear such as waterproof boots or gloves. Generally our walks will be easy hikes, and may involve multiple stops in vehicles. Please be prepared for a shortage of bathrooms and bring along food and water as needed. Required text: *'Plants of the Pacific Northwest- Pojar & McKinnon'* (some loaners available).

Apprenticeship Program

Apprenticeship seasons run solstice to equinox, then equinox to solstice, and follow the seasonal rounds and moon cycles. This is my core program for those who wish to deepen their knowledge. Skills will be shared through apprenticeship style mentoring activities at the Hjertoos House or on excursions for harvesting activities with a focus on traditional foods, medicines, fiber, and sustainable skills.

You will participate with me in my work in plant propagation, harvests (wild and cultivated), processing, preserving and using native, wildcrafted and garden plants for food, medicine, fiber and more, as the seasons progress. Skills building activities will include woodworking, carving, basketry, fiber work, permaculture projects and more, and will be guided by your interests. The low cost of the program reflects the help you will be offering me in resource gathering, projects in my permaculture design that build skills, and more!

Apprentices will also be on an email contact list to be invited to additional impromptu apprenticeship opportunities throughout the season which often arise with little notice but can be rare opportunities.

Deposit Policy

Small class sizes mean that last minute cancellations can really make or break the financial success of a class. Therefore, deposits are refundable with a \$10 processing fee within 14 days of registration, 50% within 7 days, and non-refundable within 7 days unless your space in a full class is replaced by another.
